

MGIS STUDENTS' IMPRESSIVE RESULTS AT MAY/JUNE 2011 CAMBRIDGE EXAMS



CONTEXT

Against the backdrop of an unstable learning time, an electoral dispute not going away but threatening to get worse (and did get worse) and the difficulties of getting acclimatize to a new environment in time to be able to write an exams, the unprecedented high grades output of our students at the recent May/June Cambridge exams is a feat worth mentioning and celebrating.

A-LEVEL Marvel

Over the last three years, MGIS students have turned in 100% distinction results on their AICE Certificates and proceeded to the institutions of their choice; all world renowned and prestigious.

The May/June 2011 exams results however, was the icing on the cake with Miss Christa Daboiko, currently studying psychology at the University of Southampton, obtaining 3 As and an A star in psychology thereby proving her readiness and potential for higher level academic work.

The A star in Psychology (first time on offer in MGIS) gains a place amongst the 4.4% globally that obtained this grade category. A-Level results in Biology and Literature in English equally ranked quite exceptional globally.

What is more, she achieved this within a year of studies; the A-Levels is a two-year programme.

She admits the input of her lecturers in the form of timely feedback and encouragement coupled with a relentless determination to succeed were vital reasons for her results.

AS-Level Performance

We recorded a 95% pass in all subjects taken at the AS Level with students doing very well in French and Law – four As in French and B in Law.

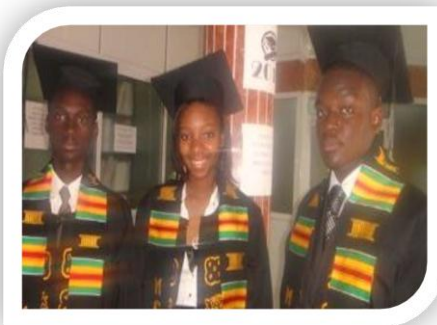
IGCSE stole the show

Our collective efforts returned a 100% pass rate with no ungraded (U) outcomes.

ICE Results: 1 distinction and 4 merits.

The IGCSE top spot was taken by Adithya Srimadeva, currently studying on academic scholarship at Morning Glory's Sixth Form College. He obtained 6 As and two A stars. With a total of nine subjects, his performance marked a significant milestone in the quest for academic excellence on the IGCSE at MGIS.

He said personal effort and a strong desire to excel coupled with all the help one can get from teachers go a long way in ensuring an excellent academic output. His dream is to become an astrophysicist and has started serious work towards the realization of this dream.
